

January 1980 - The US exports 8,000 BF of Ash lumber to China - the first shipments ever recorded to that country, according to USDA FAS data.

February 22, 1980: In the "Miracle on Ice" game, the US Olympic hockey team beats the heavily favored Soviet Union 4-3 to advance to the gold medal game. The Soviet team had won gold at the previous four Olympic games and had routed the US 10-3 in an exhibition game just 13 days beforehand. Two days later, the US defeated Finland 4-2 to capture the gold medal.

May 18, 1980: A magnitude 5.1 earthquake one mile beneath Mount St. Helens in Washington triggers a massive landslide and volcanic eruption that rips the top 1,300 feet off the mountain and spews hundreds of millions of tons of ash and other debris 12 miles into the air. Fifty-seven people die in the disaster, as do most of the wildlife, plants, and trees in the surrounding area.

July 1, 1980: "O Canada" officially becomes the national anthem of Canada.

July 7, 1981: President Ronald Reagan nominates Sandra Day O'Connor to the Supreme Court. She is unanimously approved by the Senate on September 21st and is sworn in as the first female Supreme Court justice on September 25th.

July 9, 1981: Donkey Kong debuts in video game arcades in Japan and is introduced in the US three weeks later. Players take the role of Mario, the hero, as he attempts to rescue the damsel in distress Pauline from the villainous title character. During the next 40 years, Nintendo's total gross revenues on the Mario game franchise are estimated at between \$30 and \$39 billion.

July 29, 1981: Prince Charles, heir to the British throne, marries Lady Diana Spencer at St. Paul's Cathedral in London. The event is watched on television by almost one billion people in dozens of countries around the world.





January 2, 1982: The Hardwood Market Report begins its 60th year in business. March 6, 1983: Motorola begins selling the DynaTAX 8000X mobile phone to consumers. It is the first commercially available cell phone.

1984: Virginia Tech becomes the first major public university to require freshmen engineering students to purchase a personal computer.

March 11, 1985: Mikhail Gorbachev becomes general secretary of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union. During the next several years, he implements policies known as perestroika ("restructuring") and glasnost ("openness") to reform and modernize the country's economic and political systems. Gorbachev also engages in closer relationships with western countries, including the United States and the United Kingdom.



September 11, 1985: Pete Rose's first inning single for the Cincinnati Reds against the San Diego Padres is career hit number 4,192 - breaking the Major League Baseball hit record set by Ty Cobb nearly 60 years earlier. Rose's career hit total of 4,256 still stands as the most all-time.

December 1985: The National Wood Flooring Association is founded at a meeting of industry leaders in St. Louis, MO. Today, NWFA's membership includes manufacturers, distributors, retailers, installers, and companies in other segments of the wood flooring supply chain.




January 28, 1986: 76 seconds into its mission to study Halley's Comet and deploy a communications satellite, Space Shuttle Challenger disentigrates over the Atlantic Ocean. The disaster resulted in a 32-month pause in the Space Shuttle program and the cancellation of the Teacher in Space program.







S&P 500 index around the time of the crash





March 13, 1989: About 6 million people across Québec lose power for over 9 hours after a coronal mass ejection from the Sun disrupts the operations of the Hydro-Québec power grid.

June 4, 1989: Chinese troops and police attack pro-democracy protesters in Beijing's Tiananmen Square. Estimates for the death toll range from 300 to several thousand, with thousands more arrested.

October 17, 1989: A magnitude 6.9 earthquake rocks the San Francisco Bay Area. The earthquake causes 67 fatalities, 42 of which result from the collapse of a 1-1/4 mile section of the Nimitz Freeway. Property damage exceeds \$5 billion. Notably, the disaster happens less than 30 minutes before the San Francisco Giants and Oakland Athletics are scheduled to begin the World Series at San Francisco's Candlestick Park.

November 9, 1989: East Berlin's Communist Party announces that East German citizens are free to cross into West Berlin beginning at midnight that day. Starting that night and throughout the next several days, individuals use hammers and picks to chip away pieces of the Berlin Wall, with cranes and bulldozers assisting in tearing down whole sections. West and East Germany are officially reunified as one country less than a year later.
