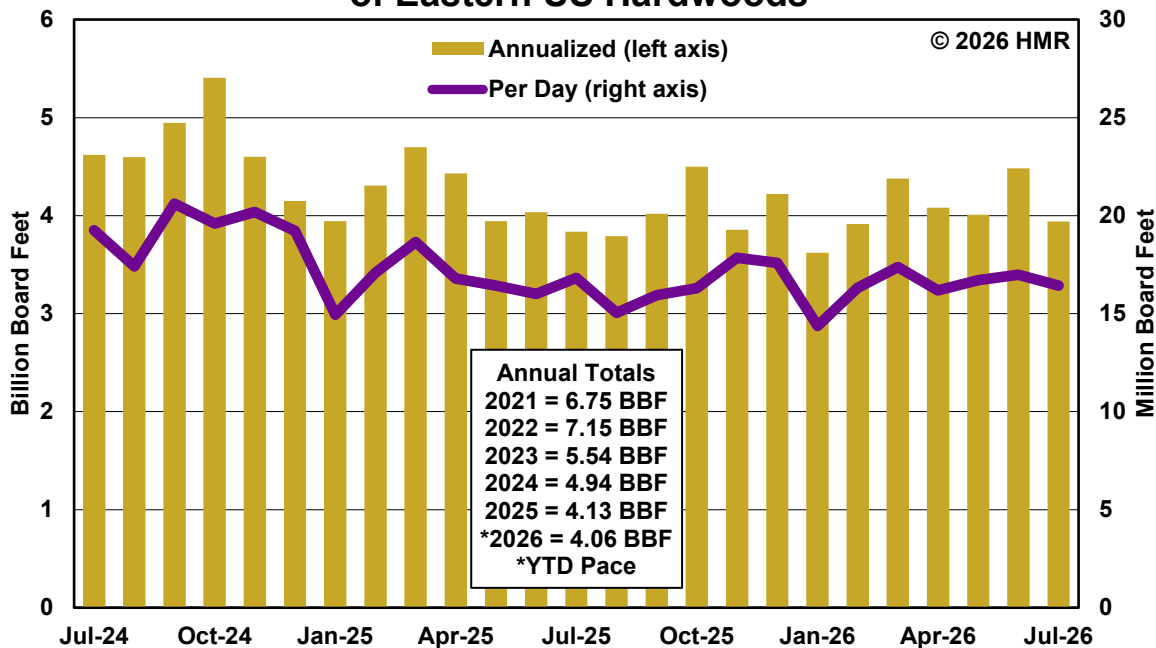

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SOUTHERN AREA

Comments

Amid concerns about sawmill closures, the chilly #2A&3A Oak market, and freight rates rising again, comments about Ash have been a clear bright spot circulating among Southern hardwood contacts.

While the positive remarks began several weeks ago, reported prices are now bearing this out. For the first time in recorded HMR history for the region, green 4/4 Fas Ash hit \$1,500 per thousand board feet this week. While not in record-breaking territory, demand and reported prices for kiln dried Ash have also advanced lately.

There are different factors at play in each of the three hardwood-producing regions, as well as different variations to the Ash that is cut, but it is important to note that the South is the area least impacted by the spread of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB). While sections of Arkansas and Texas have become infested in recent years, much of Mississippi, Alabama, South Carolina, and Georgia remain EAB-free.

Overall, markets for green grade lumber remain slow in the South, and interest in industrial items is flat. Reduced international demand continues to impact the kiln dried market, with White Oak the hardest hit species.

ASH: Warm, dry weather continues in the region, providing little impediment to loggers cutting lowland species like Ash. Reported prices drive increases in all green #2A&Btr listings across all thicknesses. On the kiln dried side, the listings for both 4/4 and 8/4 Fas increase, accompanied by favorable reports about demand.

#2A&3A OAK: There is little energy in the #2A&3A Oak market. Residential flooring plants are not buying in significant volumes, and crosstie quotas across the region are ensuring the amount of lower-grade Oak available to purchase remains high. Contacts across the South, particularly west of the Mississippi River, report that truck trailer flooring plants are increasing purchases, but overall demand for #2A&3A Oak is flat. The #2A&3A Red and White Oak listings remain intact.

RED OAK: Markets for green and kiln dried Red Oak have flattened out, with reported prices leading to no changes for any grade or thickness this week. One Mississippi seller noted Red Oak is moving well, but comments

across the South have been more muted of late. International demand for the species has taken a knock recently. Last week's news that Turkey has barred all Oak imports is another small dent in interest from abroad.

WHITE OAK: Though it would be a stretch to classify interest in White Oak as poor, it is clear that supply is larger than demand in the South. The downturn in purchasing by the stave industry and international buyers has certainly made an impact. On the green side, reductions are made to the 5/4 Fas&1f and 4/4 through 8/4 #1C listings this week. "#1C is dead," one Southern contact said. "We had to sell some at a dirty dog cheap price." Kiln dried prices continue to fall. Information gathered this week drops the listings for 4/4 Fas, 4/4 #1C, 4/4 #2A, and 5/4 #1C. Except for 4/4 #2A, there are also decreases to either the low ends, high ends, or both ends of the ranges for these items.

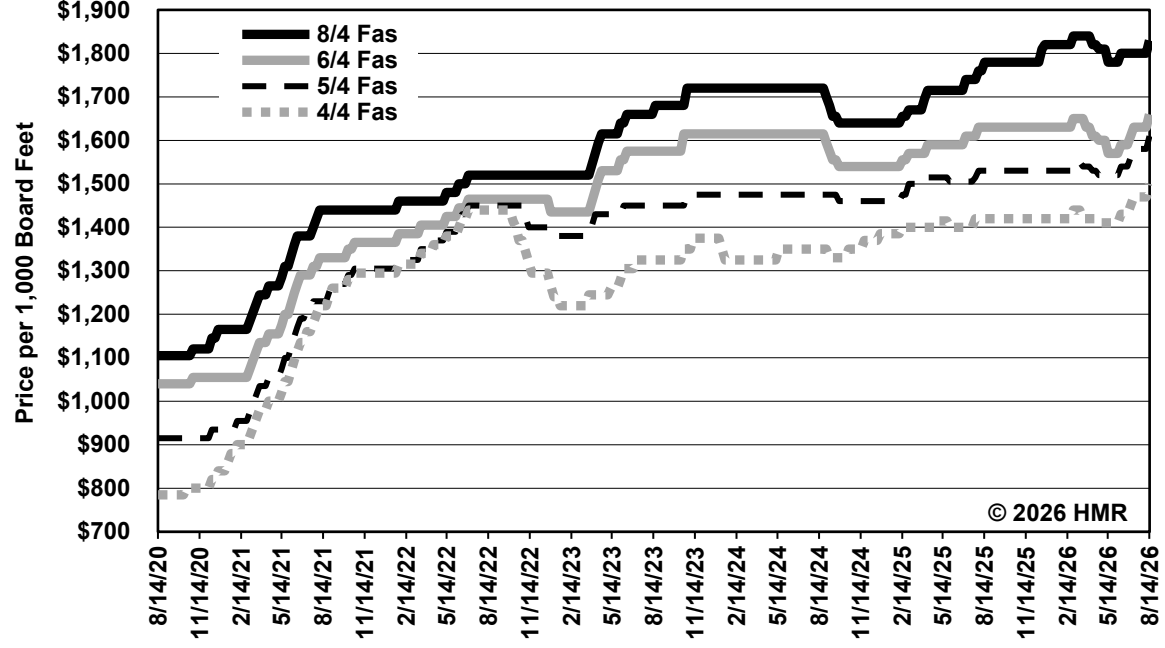
PECAN & HICKORY: The market for Southern Pecan & Hickory is stable. Area secondary manufacturers are known to be buying the species, but not in numbers that are leading to any changes in published prices.

POPLAR: Supply and demand for both green and kiln dried Poplar are well balanced. Competitive prices for green 4/4 #1C can be found, but availability is mixed. A drawback in interest from international buyers, particularly from Vietnam, has cooled the kiln dried market. The only changes for either green or kiln dried Poplar this week are reductions to the lower ends of the ranges for 4/4 #1C dry stock.

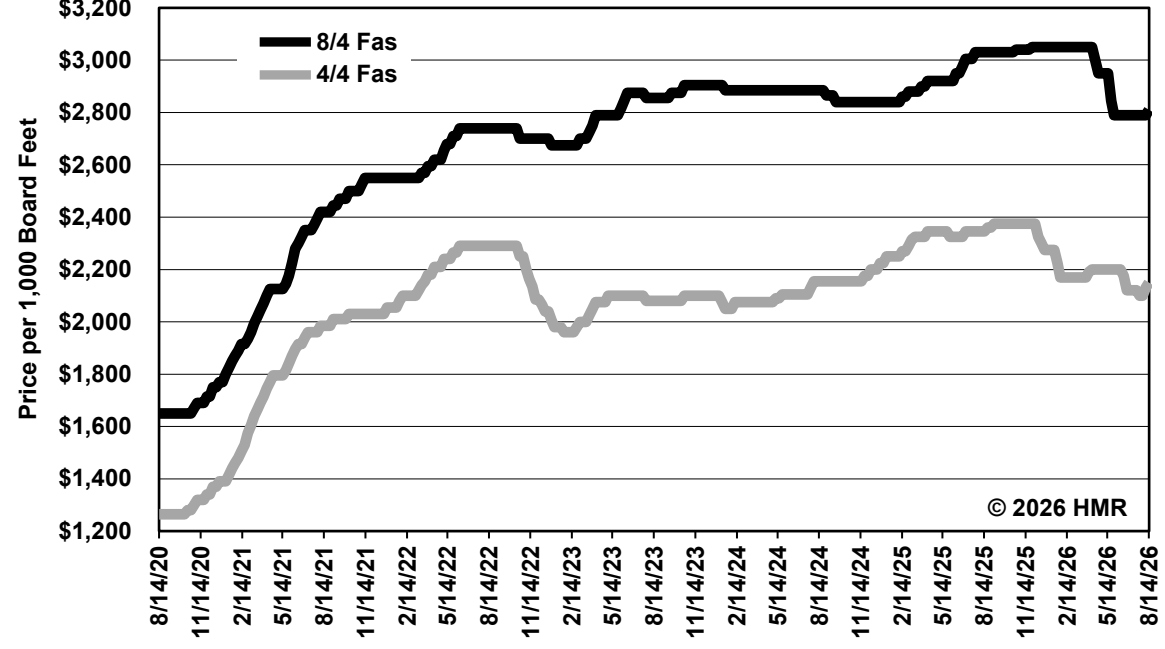
BOARD ROAD, FRAMESTOCK, CANTS & TIES: Contacts continue to report to HMR/Fastmarkets that markets for Southern mat timbers, crane mats, and board road are busy, though the listing and range for board road are unmoved. The recent burst of framestock purchasing by secondary manufacturers in the South has plateaued, and there are no changes to the price ranges, either Oak or Mixed Species, in this edition.

Crosstie quotas are still in place on both sides of the Mississippi, though one Western contact is hopeful that his quota may loosen in the coming quarter. This week, tie ranges are unchanged. Since the tie downturn has boosted Southern cant production, the cant market in this region is lagging those in the Appalachian and Northern regions, leading to no changes to the listing or range.

Comments

Hardwood sawmill production in the Appalachian region fell 8.1% in July from June, less than the 11.1% decline in the North and 19.5% reduction in the South, according to estimates by HMR/Fastmarkets. The July decline more than offset the percentage gain in June. While some mills only took one day off for the Fourth of July holiday, others closed for an entire week. Fewer sawing days and slower Chinese demand contributed to July’s decrease.

Considerably more prices fell than rose this week, with reductions necessary for some producers to generate orders and cash flow during the dog days of summer, when kilns turn quicker due to high temperatures. Concentration yards and secondary wood products manufacturers are still purchasing mainly for short-term needs. Domestic and international markets are seemingly awaiting clearer directional trends in their respective economies and the end of the US-Iran war. Interest in rift and quartered White Oak has reportedly picked up, but green plainsawn White Oak remains oversupplied. Contacts report more activity for Walnut but slightly less demand for Hickory. Brown Hard Maple in 9 to 16-foot lengths remains in short supply, but almost everything else is readily available, according to a longtime wood products manufacturer.

ASH: Demand for this species is widely described as

good, with limited green production moving steadily to yards and end users, and kiln dried stocks shipping at typical volumes to foreign buyers. Most green prices are at or near the published figures, but information lifts the listings for 5/4 Fas&1f by \$25 per thousand board feet (\$/MBF). While most kiln dried figures are unchanged, the 4/4 Fas ranges and 8/4 #1C listings warrant increases.

BASSWOOD: Basswood supply and demand have been balanced most of the year. However, green production now exceeds low demand, prompting reductions to all 4/4 figures and to the listings for 5/4 Fas&1f, #2A, and #2B. All kiln dried figures remain intact.

CHERRY: Cherry business has moderated in recent weeks. Yards are purchasing decent quantities of green lumber for drying, but some sawmills have reduced Cherry production. Consequently, green supplies match the market’s needs. Reported prices are little changed, allowing the listings to stand. Supplies of most kiln dried items also align with demand. However, lower reported prices drive reductions to the North Central 4/4 #1C figures, reflecting an imbalance between supply and demand for that item.

HICKORY: Demand for Hickory shows signs of moderating from strong levels. One wood component manufacturer said he's not bringing in as much Hickory in August as he did in June and July. Regardless, purchasing by flooring plants is strong enough to absorb declines by other sectors. Gains in prior weeks hold all green and kiln dried figures steady in this edition.

HARD MAPLE: Appalachian contacts report higher demand for #1C Hard Maple than for Fas and #2A, though "better" is relative because overall demand is muted. Green supplies are in better balance with demand now than a few months ago. However, #1&2 White 5/4 #1C&Btr prices have a downward bias, and the listings retreat. Weakness is also evident in reported kiln dried #1&2 White 4/4 #2A prices, which drive reductions to the listings and high-end ranges. The high-end ranges for #1&2 White 5/4 Fas also retreat.

SOFT MAPLE: Market circumstances are less favorable for Soft Maple than for Hard Maple. Consumption is steady-to-slower in the cabinet, case goods, and component sectors. Secondary manufacturers that replenished inventories earlier this year are well situated with Soft Maple and are controlling purchases accordingly. Reported prices warrant reductions to the listings for green Sap&Btr 4/4 #1C and 4/4 #2A along with Unselected 4/4 #2A. Lower kiln dried 4/4 Fas prices align with comments that Fas is the weakest grade and drive decreases to the list-

ings and ranges in each color designation. The Sap&Btr and Unselected 5/4 #1C listings also lose ground.

#2A&3A OAK: August purchases of #2A&3A Red Oak by some residential flooring plants are among the highest of the year, ensuring adequate supplies as production and sales of Red Oak flooring outpace those for White Oak. Truck trailer flooring manufacturers are also buying relatively large volumes. The demand pull from the two sectors is absorbing #2A&3A production, which is up for some mills that are flush with Red Oak logs. Sellers and buyers are trading #2A&3A Red Oak and #2A Alone Red Oak at prices that keep the listings steady. Meanwhile, lackluster demand is forcing some sellers to lower 4/4 #2A&3A White Oak prices, as reflected in reductions of \$10/MBF to the listings this week.

RED OAK: Domestic demand for this species is fair. However, Chinese markets have cooled, and less Red Oak is moving to Europe amid the region's vacation season. Kiln dried 4/4 Fas prices are succumbing to competitive pressures; the listings and low-end ranges are reduced. Meanwhile, the high-side ranges for 5/4 #1C edge up. Green Red Oak production is meeting the market's needs and is supported by steady sales to residential flooring plants. Reported and observed transactions keep all green Red Oak listings steady despite reports that certain mills are accepting slightly lower 4/4 #1C prices to generate orders.

WHITE OAK: Demand is stronger for kiln dried plain-sawn 4/4 Fas White Oak than for #1C. The same is true on the green side, supported by one sawmiller’s comment that he’s sold out of Fas&1f but has three loads of #1C looking for homes. Information warrants reductions to the listings for green 4/4 #1C, 5/4 #1C, and 4/4 #2A&3A. Weakness is similarly evident in kiln dried 4/4 #1C prices, prompting reductions to the listings and low-end ranges. Conversely, upward momentum continues for 6/4 Fas White Oak; the listings are raised for a second consecutive week, and the ranges also move higher in this edition. Notably, the 4/4 Fas listings hold steady for a 10th consecutive week, suggesting a price floor has been reached.

POPLAR: Mills, yards, distributors, and end users are processing or consuming steady amounts of Poplar. In recent weeks, there have been as many reports of level as of slightly bloated inventories. Reports are similarly mixed with Poplar as a best-selling species for some but a worst-seller for others. To better align with reported information, the green 4/4 Fas&1f listings are lowered by \$20/MBF, but all other listings hold. Most kiln dried figures are also unchanged except for the 5/4 #1C listings, which are reduced by \$10/MBF.

WALNUT: Supplies of green 4/4 through 6/4 #2A Walnut lag good market interest. Prices for these items continue to trend higher, and the listings are raised accordingly, join-

ing gains to the 5/4 Fas&1f listings. Supplies of 4/4 #1C are slightly higher than demand, however, with reported prices prompting a reduction to the listing. Contacts continue to identify #1C and #2A as the best-selling grades of kiln dried Walnut. Prices in observed transactions for 8/4 Fas and 8/4 #2A Walnut have risen, driving increases to the listings and noted ranges.

FRAMESTOCK, CANTS, TIES, & BOARD ROAD: Framestock production is sufficient for buyers’ current needs, which have increased slightly as tariffs and elevated shipping costs have made plywood imports more costly. The ranges for Oak and Mixed Species framestock hold steady.

Comments about pallet sector demand remain largely positive, including from one producer who says his cant production moves out “right away” to regular customers at steady prices. The cant listing and range accurately reflect reported prices. Most pallet industry contacts describe on-hand cant and lumber inventories as adequate, while finished goods sales are fair and inventories are adequate.

Some producers are reporting higher prices for crossties, resulting in an increase to the high end of the range in the Southern Appalachian area. Quotas remain in place, however, because treating yard inventories are elevated.

Survey respondents report fair-to-lower demand for board road. No changes are warranted to the listing or range.

Comments

The rebound in kiln dried White Oak prices is the standout story in the Northern region this week. The #1C and #2A listings posted their first gains since April, while the Fas listings jumped by \$100 per thousand board feet (\$/MBF), just the second increases to those listings this year. Oversupply had led to persistent declines in White Oak prices since early 2025, but it appears now that a price floor has been reached in the Northern region, at least for kiln dried items.

Canadian wood products beginning August 19. The two countries are currently engaged in trade talks to prevent the implementation of these tariffs, but it's unclear if any agreement is close to being reached. If enforced, the tariffs would be a major disruption for the Northern hardwood market.

ASH: Both green and kiln dried Ash prices are unchanged this week in the Northern region. Contacts still report good demand for the species, including for export, even

Meanwhile, the US is scheduled to levy a 50% tariff on

with a broader seasonal slowdown in Chinese demand. One producer in the Upper Midwest recently told HMR/Fastmarkets that he's never seen such robust demand for Ash as seen in recent months. It's possible that the potential extinction of the species in North America is driving increased demand. The proliferation of the Emerald Ash Borer across the continent is keeping Ash lumber production low, providing sustained upward pressure to prices.

ASPEN: Mills that are still cutting and drying Aspen report firm demand for the species, as has been the case throughout this summer. Producers are receiving enough inquiries to move existing production at steady-to-firmer prices. Published prices for green and kiln dried Aspen are well above year-ago levels, as decent demand has outstripped production, leading to persistent price gains. This week, the kiln dried 4/4 #2A listings and ranges are raised, but are the only adjustments for now.

BASSWOOD: Limited production is supporting Basswood prices. The 5/4 #2A listings and range numbers are raised slightly this week. No other changes are in order. Comments about demand are mixed: Certain producers are struggling to move the species, some describe the market as "mediocre," and others with established customer bases are easily moving their output at steady prices.

BIRCH: All the green #1C&Btr Birch listings rise for a second straight week in the Northern region, as reported prices trended higher again. These gains are driven primarily by limited production. Sawmills are struggling to turn profits cutting Birch at today's relatively low prices. Prior to the slight rebound in the past two weeks, green Birch prices had fallen continually since August 2025 and were at the lowest levels in more than seven years. Most producers describe demand for kiln dried Birch as weak and are struggling to move existing inventories. New US tariffs on Canadian wood products are set to go into effect next week, which would further hamper Canadian producers already struggling with weak markets for this species.

HARD MAPLE: Northern green Hard Maple prices have stabilized over the past three weeks following sharp declines in July. Prices came under downward pressure as higher summertime temperatures forced producers to accept lower bids in order to move lumber before it stained. A new equilibrium appears to have been reached, at least for now. Kiln dried Hard Maple, especially #1C&Btr, is

still moving well for producers at fairly steady prices. The 4/4 Fas listings have not changed in more than two months. The #1C and #2A figures have come down a bit in recent weeks yet remain well above prices from a year ago. No adjustments are in order for any kiln dried listings or ranges in this issue.

SOFT MAPLE: Kiln dried Sap&Btr Soft Maple remains oversupplied, especially 8-foot Fas lumber. Reported prices are maintaining a clear downward trend, lowering all kiln dried Fas listings, across thicknesses, in both color or sorts. A sawmill in the Upper Midwest recently told HMR/Fastmarkets that it's currently "impossible to make any profit on the species." Kiln dried Soft Maple prices have fallen continually since May. Producers have been struggling to move the species, outside of Brown uppers, which have been a hot item throughout this year. The green listings have been more stable than kiln dried throughout this summer and are again unchanged this week.

RED OAK: Northern kiln dried Red Oak prices have held up fairly well in recent weeks, despite a seasonal slowdown in Chinese purchasing weighing on demand for the species. Most kiln dried listings are down slightly from year-to-date highs reached earlier this summer. This week, the high ends of the 4/4 and 5/4 #1C ranges are lowered, but all other kiln dried listings and range numbers are unchanged. Green prices have also been under downward pressure in recent weeks amid a seasonal uptick in production, but those declines have also been slight. Green listings are well above year-ago levels and are all unchanged this week. A flooring manufacturer in Eastern Canada recently described supplies of green #2A&3A Red Oak as "tight," while a green sawmill in Minnesota has not lowered its prices this summer, as rainy weather during July limited production. All in all, the state of the Red Oak market in the Northern region is decent enough, despite the summer doldrums, with most producers moving the species at steady prices.

WHITE OAK: The kiln dried White Oak listings and ranges rise this week for all grades in the Northern region. Reported prices show that upward pressure has become widespread enough to justify the increases. For several months, certain producers with high-quality White Oak have been reporting firmer prices, but prior to this week, the broader market was mostly stagnant. This week's 4/4 Fas gains are especially notable, as the listings jumped by \$100/MBF to five-month highs. The kiln dried #1C and #2A listings also posted their first weekly gains since late

April. Northern White Oak prices had been in a precipitous decline since the beginning of 2025, as reduced consumption by the barrel stave industry stimulated lumber production. But now it appears that long-awaited price floor has been reached, followed by a rebound, at least for kiln dried items. The green listings, however, are unchanged this week at year-to-date lows and have yet to post any gains so far in 2026.

PALLET LUMBER, CANTS, TIES, & BOARD ROAD:
The rally in pallet cant prices continues this week. The listing posts its fifth weekly gain in the past two months, climbing to the highest level since March 2023. Both ends

of the range are also raised this week. Limited production and a seasonal uptick in demand have led to persistent price gains for cants throughout this summer.

Regional tie producers are benefiting from increased purchasing at a treatment plant in Wisconsin. Most producers have had their quotas lifted or eased in recent weeks. Prior adjustments have the tie price range in order in this issue.

Conditions in the board road market are unchanged this week, according to producers. The listing and range are raised slightly because of reported prices above the high end of last week’s range.

OAK STRIP FLOORING

Figures in the Appalachian and Southern area columns are estimates of manufacturers’ **predominant** prices for unfinished Oak strip flooring; prices in the other column are estimates of **prevailing industry ranges** of manufacturers’ prices. Variations in prices are due, in part, to differences in freight, the nature of markets, volumes ordered and shipped, etc. Prices are for truckload quantities graded in accordance with rules or comparable standards set forth by NOFMA. **Prices are in US Dollars per square foot (SF) and are net of dealer discount fees and commissions.** Figures in bold print signify price changes. Solid hardwood flooring’s declining share of the total flooring coverings market is well documented. It is also felt intuitively and is highly evident in anecdotal reports. For example, neighborhood social media posts asking what products people have used to replace solid or engineered hardwood flooring result in some head shaking and eye rolling about the value subtracted from existing homes. Many model homes—even those in high-priced segments—don’t overtly showcase hardwood flooring options but have plenty of luxury vinyl plank and laminate “wood-look” flooring samples. It might sound a bit hyperbolic, but younger generations visiting model homes have no idea what solid Oak flooring looks like, or that it was prevalent in their parents’ childhood homes.

Laminate wood-look flooring competes with Oak flooring for market share. Laminate’s share of the total floor coverings market is cooling. US laminate flooring sales at the first point of distribution totaled \$1.1 billion in 2025, down 3.2% from 2024. By volume, laminate shipments fell 5.6% to 871 million square feet, which put laminate at 4.7% of total industry sales, the lowest share since 2018. Analysts attribute the decline to a large drop-off in imports from

Europe alongside declining receipts from China, impacted by shifts in US trade and tariffs increasing the costs of imported flooring items.

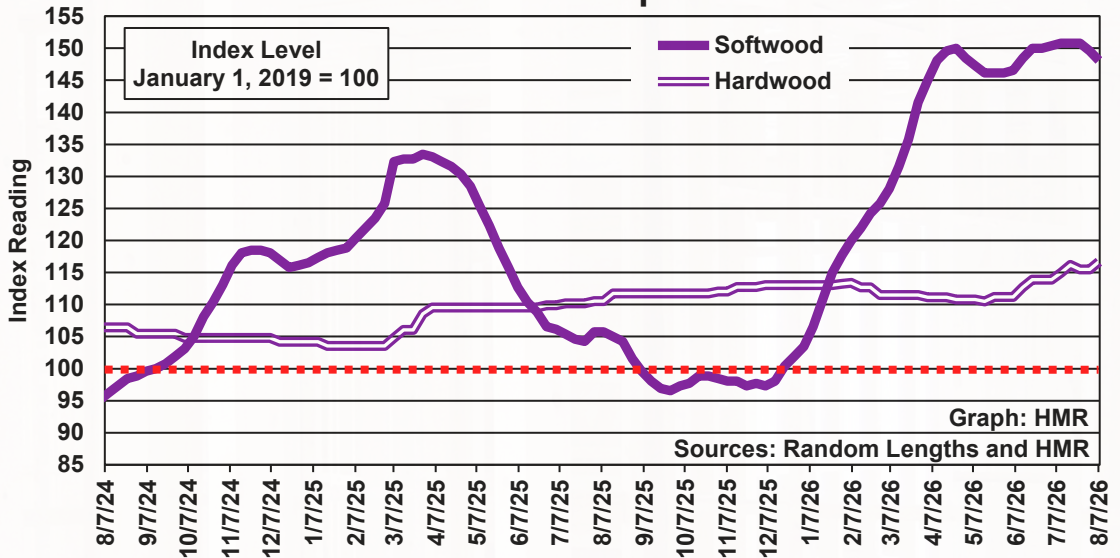
Solid hardwood flooring is still the gold standard. Nearly half (46%) of consumers rate hardwood flooring as a premium product compared to vinyl and wood hybrids (39%), carpet (35%), resilient (34%), and laminate flooring (33%), according to Cognition Smart Data information cited in an article on greenbuildermedia.com. The firm’s research also found that 66% of consumers want hardwood flooring in their dream home, and 79% believe it enhances property value. The article’s upshot: Consumers prefer hardwood flooring, but their preference isn’t always what they install due to product and labor cost considerations. Laminate’s declining market share should provide competitive advantages to domestically produced hardwood flooring, even if the gains are more fractional than robust.

Among the changes in this week’s price matrix, the range for 3/4” Sel&Btr White Oak edges lower. Meanwhile, Sel&Btr Red Oak gains further momentum, with reported prices prompting increases to the 3/4” listings.

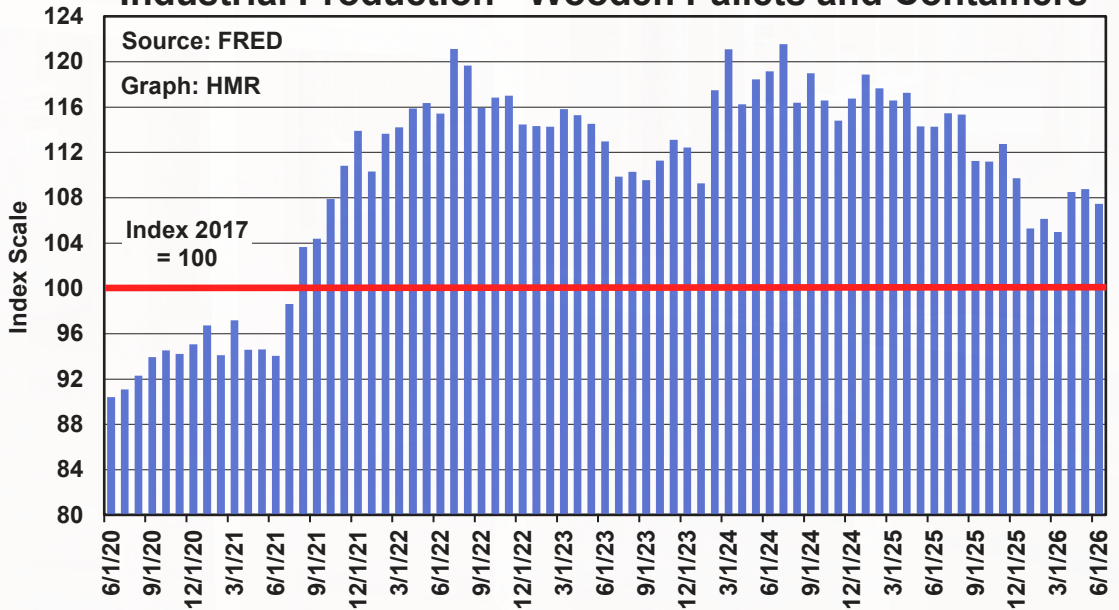

Wood Pallet and Packaging Raw Material Composite Indices



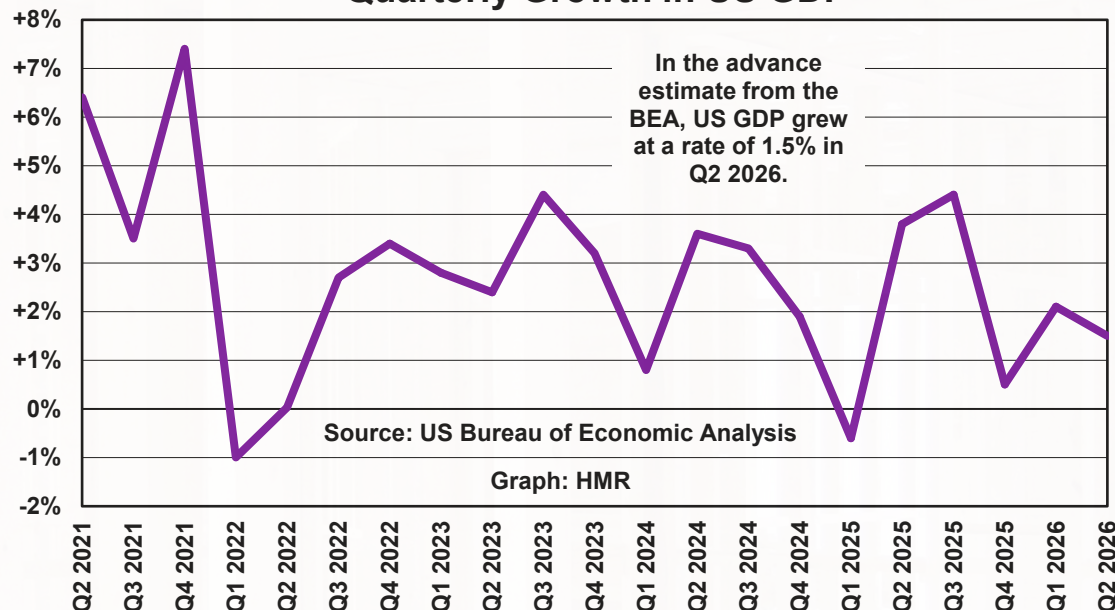
Industrial Production - Wooden Pallets and Containers



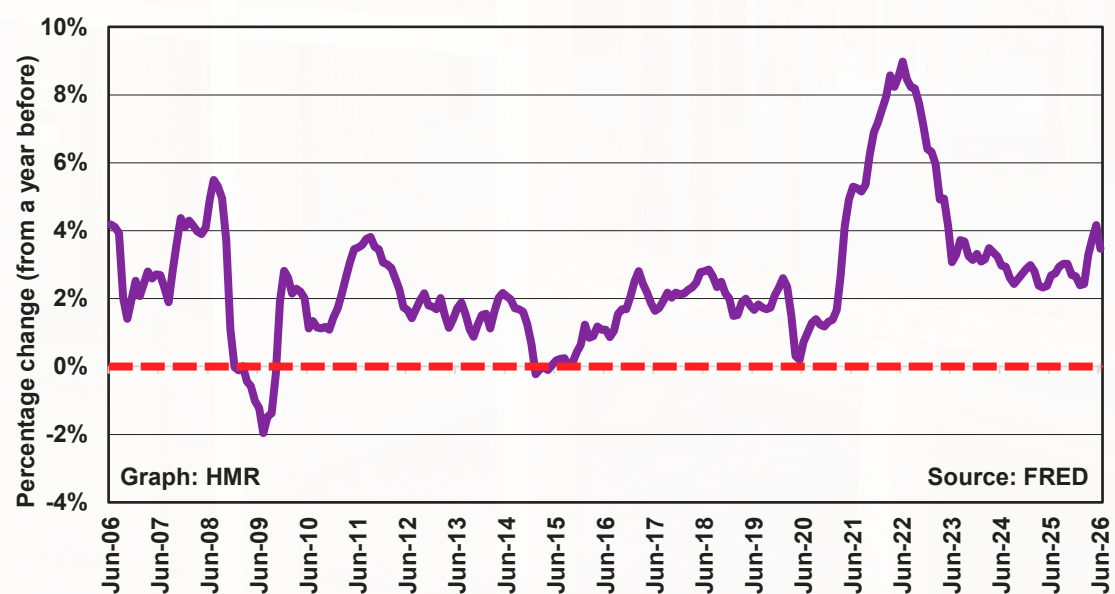
